#### JUNE'S PROGRAM by Barbara Royer

Our speaker for June is Dave Gatley. Dave's topics will be Military and Night Photography.

Dave is an Independent Photojournalist covering assignments primarily West of the Rockies and along the southwestern Border States. Formerly the Chief Photographer with the San Diego Bureau of the *Los Angeles Times*, he has been a professional photographer for over 33 years. In addition to the southwestern United States, Dave has covered assignments all over the world, including such locations as Mexico, Bosnia, Iraq, Kuwait, UAE, Bahrain, Turkey, Afghanistan, Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan, Pakistan, Croatia, Hungary, Germany, and England.

Nominated three times for a Pulitzer Prize, and once a finalist, a sampling Dave's news work includes, the San Ysidro Massacre (also known as the McDonald's Massacre), the Mexico City Earthquake, the Olympics, hundreds of fires, floods, hurricanes, school shootings in Springville, OR, Columbine HS, Denver, CO, to unusual incidents like the Heaven's Gate cult. Although his assignments have taken him all over the world, he is best known for his coverage of the Southwest Border, it's immigration issues, drug smuggling and corruption related stories.

Dave has been a board member and vice president of the LA Chapter of the American Society of Media Photographers and he is currently on the San Diego Chapter board and is the vice president. He was also a previous president of the San Diego News Photographers Association. In addition to lecturing, Dave teaches Photojournalism at Point Loma Nazarene University, San Diego.
