My Most Significant Photograph

What photograph has touched you the means, means the most to you, whether you or another photographer shot the image?

A book entitled Talking Pictures by Marvin Heiferman and Carole Kismaric gave me the idea for our program. "Living in this image world, the idea for Talking Pictures came to us. Because of our lifelong respect for and love of photographs, we wanted to find out if there were, for each of us, pictures that do not disappear, pictures that mattered because we could not, or would not, let go of them. So, we decided to talk to people about the pictures that were important to them. If it is true that photographic images have changed our lives, we wanted to know why. How have photographs shaped our personal histories and our collective imagination? How do we read pictures? What do we read into them?

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We asked each person to come up with one picture that mattered the most. The image that seduced, inspired, taught, frightened, amused, offended, obsessed, informed, or provoked him or her.

Every person in Talking Pictures Rook a risk. We never knew how much people would reveal of themselves, how willing they would be to let go, to follow the avenues, associations, and feelings that a picture could provoke. Sometimes the tiniest part of a picture--a detail or a gesture--led to a deeply felt truth or conviction. Every picture turned out to have layers--emotional, intellectual, and social.

A single picture has the power to stop us in our tracks and reveal to us just who we are." The images can be a poster, family photograph, an advertisement, etc. Bring in an image that talks to you!

October's topic will be 'self-portrait'. Please bring up to two images that you have taken. Consider how each picture can communicate something about yourself to the viewer.

PHOTO EXHIBITIONS/NEWS

The Ordover Gallery is presenting "Ceaseless" by Philipp Scholz Rittermann who is a renowned North County photographer, whose work has been shown extensively and is in the permanent collection of many museums, including the Museum of Modern Art in New York, The Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, the Museum of Photographic Arts in San Diego and the Bibliotheque Nationale in Paris. In "Ceaseless", Rittermann exhibits images from three different bodies of work: panoramic sequences, miniaturization images, and straight landscapes. His panoramic sequences make visible that which the human eye cannot normally view at one time. Rittermann's miniaturization series uses selective focus to obscure distinctions between reality and make-believe. Photographs from the third body of work are straight landscapes, which involve visual relationships between elements found in nature, for example, a cloud reflecting the curvature of a hillside.

The exhibit will run from Sept. 17 thru Nov. 27,2005.

Wouldn't it be nice to have a light table at your fingertips? Instead of holding slides and negatives up to a light, try using your computer monitor. Simply open a blank document in your word processing software. The plain white light source works well as a substitute for a light table.
