#### **MEMBER SHARE** by Barbara Swanson

The topic for July's membershare is Flash/Fill Flash. Please bring one or two images to share. If you are showing electronic pictures, please try to send them in advance to the projectionist via email. Otherwise, it takes a lot of time to get them loaded and organized during the meeting.

This month's topic was inspired by a recent trip that I took, where I needed to use fill flash but was unfamiliar with how to use it effectively. I had to learn quickly, and used the digital review on my camera a lot to help me determine the proper amount of fill flash to use.

Flash is often used to light up a subject when there is not enough available light. Fill flash is usually used when there is available light, but it is harsh and there are shadows that need to be lightened. One example of this is people photography, where areas of the face are shadowed. If the person or subject can't be moved to an area with better lighting, then fill flash can help to fill in the shadows to produce more balanced tonalities. It can also be used in overcast conditions to subtly brighten the subject or introduce a catchlight into the eyes.

How much flash power to use depends on the circumstances. Your distance to the subject, lighting conditions, etc. will influence how much flash you need. Generally, between -0.5 and -2 (more negative being weaker) on the flash setting is typical. If you are using a digital camera, you can check the exposure and make adjustments. You still want to leave shadows in the subject, and you don't want to make the use of flash obvious. Use the camera exposure you would normally use, and then dial in how much fill flash you want.

#### **MEMBER PROFILE** by Joe Erbs

Since moving from Boston to Los Angeles while in elementary school, Joe Erbs has been a L.A. boy throughout high school, community college, UCLA and 37 years of working. After retiring in 1990, he and wife Pat

moved to Oceanside to enjoy the better half of life in a near-coastal environment.



Joe's professional career was totally involved in the rocket engine field in engineering and program management positions. He got to know and love San Diego as a result of many business trips to the area.

Joe became interested in photography in high school with an old Kodak with leaky bellows. He quickly advanced to a 35mm (Argus) with an "extinction meter" which was useless. Later he scrimped to buy a range-finder camera, a Weston meter and converted a closet to a dark room to develop and print B&W. He even reloaded 35mm cartridges from cheaply available war surplus film canisters.

Active photography took a backseat during college days and the early work period. In the early days of rocket development, however, Joe did interface with industrial photographers who used high speed cameras to film engine tests and took many still shots of hardware that had been "instantaneously disassembled" during test.

In later years, he bought a SLR (Pentax H1a – heavy and durable as a tank) and then a Pentax ME (built –in meter) when his interests were for family and travel shots.

About six years ago, Joe Erbs became re-activated in photography through Chuck Leve, a NCPS member; joined the club and bought a Nikon N90s (now needing the autofocus feature). Since then he has been on commercial and club photo-shoots and taken classes.

Joe has now joined the digital SLR revolution with a D70 and continues to be amazed with the options and versatility available with the new cameras and software.

Joe has taken many photos, some good, many not, and is still waiting to get that elusive "Great Shot". He believes that NCPS, its leadership, and the members, are doing a great job in promoting the growing interest in the photography of today.


Congratulations to all...and another big thanks to Ed Stalder and his crew of NCPS volunteers who helped with the Fair again this year.

#### **Birds of Batiquitos 2007 Calendar** by Sharon Anthony



The Batiquitos Lagoon Foundation is selling a very unique 16 month 2007 calendar featuring birds found in and adjacent to Batiquitos Lagoon Ecological Reserve in Carlsbad. This calendar depicts a unique bird specie each month, with facts such as where and when you might see them, what they eat, how far they range, their breeding habits, and how to distinguish between male and female. The calendar is 12 x 12 and printed on very high quality recycled paper, and shrink wrapped for protection.

Sharon Anthony, a member of NCPS, photographed all the birds and wrote the text for the calendar. This calendar project is the result of three years of focusing on the many species found at the Lagoon. She photographed during all seasons, and includes migrating birds and several endangered species. Sharon donated the photos for the calendar, as a way to help the Batiquitos Lagoon Foundation raise money to fund their many important programs. Hopefully this calendar will bring awareness to the beautiful and unique birds that use the lagoon, and will result in needed support to preserve and protect this valuable resource.

The calendar retails at \$12.95, but will be available for purchase at the July NCPS Meeting, for \$10.00 (tax the Lens Paper JULY, 2006

included). The 16 month calendar begins with September 2006.

The Batiquitos Lagoon Foundation is a non-profit 501(c)(3) public benefit corporation, with the calendar profit used to fund their many programs. A portion of your calendar purchase price is tax deductible for income tax purposes.
