Before emailing, please size your images so that the longest side is 1024 pixels and the file is not larger than approx. 150KB. Also, please send them in advance - so two or three days before our meeting. Name the files with your initials and number 1 or 2 (in case we get A LOT of images and can only show one of yours - that way we'll know you really want the #1 shown for sure). Alternately, you can still bring in prints. However, we are discouraging that because it is so hard for people to see the images (both the judges and the members) unless the prints are VERY large!

MEMBER PROFILE Jim Wenck -Carlsbad

I was born in a log darkroom... well, not really! But I have been playing with photography for more than 40 years. Like most brothers, I blame my sister. When we were in grade school, she got a "starter" darkroom kit, but needed help with it. The kit had three small trays and a plastic frame for making contact prints.* Those small prints from 127-type (Brownie camera) film were tiny, but I was hooked on the magic of seeing an image



appear on "blank" paper! And developing my film made it even better.

My sister soon dropped the hobby, but I continued on. I set up an enlarger on a wheeled table, with all the accessories underneath. I could roll into the bathroom late at night, print for hours, and be out before sunrise. This continued through high school, where I took photos and printed them in my darkroom for the school newspaper, yearbook, and local town paper. By then I was using a Yashica twin-lens reflex camera with 2-1/4" square negatives. Only 12 shots per roll, everything manually operated, and all black-and-white.



I haven't set up the darkroom for many years. I really appreciate the freedom today of digital images; I can finally tinker with color, and I don't have to tie up the bathroom! I am currently concentrating on panoramic landscapes, something I was never able to do in an 8 x 10" tray.

When I joined NCPS about 15 years ago, we were lucky to have 20 people at a meeting! I have served as secretary,

treasurer, and membership chair, and it's fun to see how large the club has become. I'd like to encourage newer members to volunteer and help the great leadership team.

*Editor's note: a "contact print" is an ancient photographic printing method. Working in the dark, processed film (called a "negative") is pressed against photographic paper, exposed to sunlight, then developed in trays of wet chemicals... ©

We are planning a visit to the Maritime Museum at the Embarcadero on the bay in downtown San Diego. Featured are several sailing ships, a Russian submarine, and the Berkley museum. Admittance is \$12 for adults/\$9 seniors, discounted when ordering online: \$10/\$8.

If you haven't ridden the Coaster there are ticket machines that accept cash or Visa cards at each station and you must buy your roundtrip ticket before boarding. (Seniors get a discount) It is a five-minute walk from the train station to the museum. Here are the links to the Maritime Museum and Coaster. We will try to meet in the first or second car and then again on the platform at the Santa Fe Station.

QUICK AND EASY IMAGE RESIZING By MikeMcMahon

Wouldn't it be great to quickly resize an image without having to open/resize/resave within Photoshop? And wouldn't it be great if it were a non-destructive process (i.e. the resized image is saved with a new file name, preserving the original file)? If you are a Windows XP user (not Vista, not Mac), you might want to take advantage of a free tool from Microsoft to easily resize your jpg image files.

All of this is possible by using the Windows XP PowerToy called Image Resizer. Once this software is downloaded and

installed, a Resize Pictures command will be available to you when you right click on an image file name. A dialog box will open to allow you to set the degree of downsizing you desire. For purposes of emailing or web posting, select Small (640 x 480) or Medium (800 x 600). The new downsized image file's name will be "original name (Medium).jpg" which makes it easy to identify within the folder of original images.

With this easy-to-use tool, you might be encouraged to email a few more photos to friends and relatives. And your work will be well received since it will display nicely on their computer screens without burdening them with the large file size of your original image. For example, your 4 MB original image can be reduced to 100k and still look great on a computer monitor.

For more information, enter "Microsoft tools resize image" in Google. You'll see the link to the Microsoft website that offers the free download as well as a link to an excellent article by Marc Saltzman that explains more about the tool.

You might also be interested in other PowerToys, including a tool that prepares quick slide shows and a tool that allows you to view thumbnails of RAW images from within Windows.
