Kevin Connors on Back to the Future: Digital Printing from Art to Zen

Overview:


With the advent of new technology for the capturing, processing, enhancing, and printing of photographic images has come a "back to the future" effect for those photographers who are embracing the idea of "printing their own." Seventy-five years ago, there were no labs or other professional services as there are today, so photographers had to do everything inhouse, from shooting, to developing, to ultimately printing images for their clients. Thanks to the constantly evolving world of digital, photographers, as artists realizing their vision from beginning to end, are able to create beautiful works of art that will last for centuries.

This presentation will provide you with an overview of information needed to create fine art prints right out of the box and build a solid foundation for your back-to-the-future experience.

Goal:

The goal of this workshop is to provide a sequential overview of digital workflow from capture to the personal printing of fine art photography. Those attending will learn a few of the fine points of shooting, developing, enhancing, optimizing, and printing on fine art papers while realizing their artistic vision, furthering their craft, and having their work live on for hundreds of years.

Kevin M. Connors has been creating images for more than 25 years, but only recently decided to follow his photographic passion full time. From his days as a teenager in his basement working in a traditional darkroom, to today using the best in digital technology to create fine art masterpieces 60 inches and larger, Kevin has always believed in the concept of realizing artistic vision and furthering craft by being intimately involved in the creation of his art. Rather than relegate certain steps in the artistic process to others for retouching, artwork, and printing, all of his images are hand crafted from beginning to end using time-honored traditions and the latest technologies, and hand printed by Kevin himself on only the finest papers that last for centuries. MEMBER SHARE by Barbara Swanson

February's membershare topic will be "Backlighting". Please bring up to two images to share.

Backlighting refers to having the light source behind the object(s) you are photographing. While not all subjects benefit from this type of lighting, this technique can be very effective for certain subjects. Translucent or opaque materials, such as many leaves and flowers, can appear to glow when the light source

is behind them. While a person or furry animal is quite solid, backlight can really highlight hair or fur on the subject. This can be quite striking for silhouettes as well, where the subject is very dark and only the shape is really seen.



Carrie Barton - From the Food Corner...

From the what?! Yeah, well every photo club needs a section of their newsletter devoted to food, right? So here it is!

But seriously, here's the recipe from a dish a lot of folks seemed to like at the NCPS Christmas party:

Sweet Onion Corn Bake

2 large thinly sliced sweet onions

½ c butter

1 c sour cream

½ c milk

½ tsp dillweed

½ tsp salt

2 c (8oz.) shredded cheddar cheese, divided

1 egg, lightly beaten

1 can cream style corn

1 8 ½ oz. Pkg corn muffin mix

4 drops hot pepper sauce

Combine sour cream, milk, dill, and salt. Stir in ½ of the cheese. Saute onions in butter until tender. Remove from heat, and add sour cream mix. In separate bowl, combine egg, corn bread mix, hot pepper sauce, and corn. Pour egg/corn bread mix into greased 9x13 baking dish. Spoon onion mixture over the top. Sprinkle remaining cheese on top. Bake, uncovered, at 350 for 45-50 minutes or until top is set and lightly browned. Let stand for 10 minutes before cutting.
