Adobe Lightroom – Will Gibson

If you need to spend 2 hours perfecting an image, there's no program like Photoshop. But if you need to edit and work on 100 images in that time, Adobe Lightroom is the tool to use. One can think of Lightroom as a powerful blend between Bridge and Photoshop that while not replacing those programs in vour workflow, will greatly enhance vour productivity. Will Gibson will do a quick but comprehensive tour of Adobe Lightroom by actually importing, adding keywords, selecting and improving images during his talk.

Bio: Will Gibson was born in 1950 in Alhambra, CA and has called California home for all but three years in Columbus, OH (1999-2002). He turned his passion for photography into his profession in 1980, operating his own commercial studio in San Marcos, CA for 19 years. Since 1999, he has focused his efforts on producing and promoting fine art imagery as well as teaching Photography at Palomar College, and in private classes.





Early influences include Ansel Adams, Edward and Brett Weston and the host of Life magazine photographers who came into his home every week. A firm believer in learning by doing, he has studied in workshops by Larry Ford, Al Weber, and most recently John Sexton. He was an artist-in-residence at Rocky Mountain National Park in 1993 and has exhibited in many group and one-man shows in California throughout the years. He has taught photography at the Columbus College of Art & Design in Columbus, Ohio and now teaches photography (digital and conventional) as an adjunct instructor at Palomar Community College in San Marcos, CA. He is a founding member of the PhotoArts Group based in Escondido which has organized and produced more than 20 group photographic exhibitions and a workshop in the last 5 years in San Diego County.

MEMBER SHARE by Barbara Swanson

April's membershare topic is "Pets and Animals". Please bring up to two photos to share, and please review the new digital submission guidelines. If you have any questions about them, please contact the projectionist.

March's topic was (human) portraits, and April's topic should show some of the similarities between photographing people and animals. One of the common comments for last month's photos was how careful cropping of an image can really enhance it. There were a number of photos where eliminating distracting background or bright areas would really focus the viewer's attention on the eyes and face of the person. In many cases, the background is so important and can really help or hinder a photograph. This is also true for animals, so pay attention to what's around the animal you are photographing. This can be quite a challenge with an animal that won't take direction as readily as a person, so you need to think ahead. If you are photographing your pet, choose a place with good light, a good background, and where the animal is comfortable. Be all prepared, so that you don't have to waste time figuring out exposure or where you want the animal to be once you have your pet there. I have two small pets, and I get everything all set up and even photograph the area first so that I know everything is prepared. Animals often don't have much patience or will only do a cute pose once, so be ready! I also find that treats help.

If you are photographing at a zoo or beach, or wild animals, these same hints apply. Be thinking ahead for what you want, and be ready for action or a certain look. Evaluate your photo afterwards and see if cropping might enhance it.

The topic for May is "What You are Working On". Are you doing a special project or trying to improve an aspect of your photography? This is the month to show it off or get advice on how to improve in a new area.

You must, however, select the category and give the entry title such as 'Unnamed #1' and pay a \$16 fee for each entry. Unfortunately I have this problem but will be taking a cruise through the Panama Canal from April 23 thru May 7 and will be stopping at Aruba, Cartagena and several Central American ports along the way. With a little luck I will return with images suitable for exhibition at the fair.

PSA Print Contest. As I mentioned last month the NCPS is a member of the Photographic Society of America (PSA) and they have put out a call to all member clubs to join in their Print Competition. I admit that I haven't deciphered all of the schedules and rules of this competition, but I can tell you that it includes categories for commercially printed images as well as photographer printed images. There are four major category, for a total of sixteen images. I believe the first submissions are to be in October of this year. All images are to be submitted in print form, and may be any size, up 16x20. They do not encourage mounting and do not permit frames.
