
Jim Karnik Producing "The Wilds of San Diego"

The Wilds of San Diego is a proposal to produce, display and distribute a multi-media project using digital photography and high definition video to increase public awareness and appreciation for the unique beauty of wild habitats and species in San Diego County. The series will focus on connections

between wildlife, habitats and humans. The ultimate goal of this project is to reach as large an possible audience as using multiple media outlets including internet, broadcast, DVD and public presentations. The key to reaching a broader spectrum of the San Diego residents will be the use of traveling theater exhibits. These mobile theaters will be installed in public spaces such as visitor centers, libraries, public buildings and shopping malls.

Jim has been filming nature in San Diego for over 20 years. He has filmed most of the habitats and species in the county and is now excited to recapture the beauty and natural diversity of San Diego using the latest HDSLR (High Definition Single Lens Reflex) cameras, which allow for both high definition video and high-resolution still photography.





Accompanied by sample video clips from the new series, Jim will give an overview of San Diego's major natural habitats and unique qualities. Since 1987 photographer / filmmaker, Jim Karnik has focused on helping conservation organizations increase public awareness human and natural history through film, video and photography. October Member share: Portraits

One definition of portrait is "a painting, drawing, sculpture, photograph, or other likeness of an individual, especially of the face." Usually, the intention is to capture not "just" the likeness but also personality, character or mood of the subject. portrait can tell us something about the person being portrayed, but also much about the photographer by the choices made. While most people associate a portrait with a formally posed image, portraiture can encompass a variety of approaches and techniques. The subject may be unaware of the camera, as in many examples of street photography. A portrait can be candid or posed, casual or formal, depict an individual or a group while capturing and interpreting relationships between the subjects. A portrait can be an extreme close-up, focusing the viewer's gaze solely on the subject's expression and features. But portraits do not need to be limited to the depiction of the face alone; for example a photograph of somebody's hands can evoke rich associations and lets the viewer draw conclusions about the person. Likewise, a subject's gesture and stance can speak without ever showing the volumes Environmental portraits show the subjects in a surrounding offering the viewer information and clues about the person depicted. And, sometimes, just the surroundings or the depiction of a personal object can serve as a portrait that tells viewers more about the person than a "likeness of the face" could. Please submit two images that represent your approach to portraiture in the October Member Share.
