#### Stephen Burns: Improving your Landscape & Nature Photography

Stephen Burns will share some of the most commonly overlooked steps in producing a dynamic photograph that will give your images the depth and beauty that they deserve, and share the new tools Adobe has included in CS5 that enable photographers to easily select and isolate portions of the image to enhance. He will review:

1) How to decide on the image's focus and where to go from there.

2) When and how to use Sharpening and Noise Reduction in ACR.

3) Some quick steps for getting great color and snap from the start.

4) Using the new Refine Mask feature to enhance localized detail.

5) How to produce great depth and feeling in 3 simple steps.

#### September: Breaking the Rules

This month's topic was suggested by Lorenzo Pinto. I am continually amazed at the ability of children and teenagers to create visually stunning and poignant images without much prior knowledge of-or without paying much attention to-the rules of photography. Similarly, Julia Cameron, one of the pioneers of photography, created portraits that are captivating and evocative while often clearly technically flawed (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Julia\_Margaret\_Cameron).

What are the rules that we propose to ignore this month? Well, they are simply too numerous to list but they usually either deal with the elements of design and composition (rules of third, color relationships, leading lines, framing), or with technical proficiency (depth of field, exposure). So, if we think of the Rules as a photography code, let's remember what Captain Jack Sparrow said: "the code is really more what you'd call "guidelines" than actual rules...." and feel free to break them. I am looking forward to seeing inspired examples of photographs without rules.

The member share topic for October will be "Bringing Wildlife Photography to Life."

# **Tech Tip** by Mike McMahon Keyboard Shortcuts

We have all been raised with the idea that there are no shortcuts to success...just lots of hard work. Well programs like Photoshop, have <u>keyboard</u> shortcuts that can deliver success with less work. Let's discuss a few.

To quickly move around during touchup work, pressing and holding the spacebar key changes the currently active tool to the Hand Tool. The Hand Tool allows you to quickly move around within your image by clicking and dragging...a big help when you are zoomed in on an image for detailed touchup work.

To resize a tool, such as Spot Healing Brush or the Clone Stamp, use the square bracket keys. The left bracket key will make your tool smaller; the right bracket key to make it larger. The (square) bracket keys are adjacent to the 'P' key.

See your user manual or the help system for a complete list of available shortcuts. And yes, they work the same way in Photoshop Elements.
