"I have been making photographs since I was 14 years old, when I would pose the neighborhood kids at night and photograph them using a Polaroid Swinger B&W camera, long, long ago... I have a B.A. from U.C.S.D. in Visual Arts and a Master's degree in Digital Photography from Savannah

College of Art & Design. I currently teach photography at San Dieguito Academy High School in Encinitas, California, where I have taught photography for 10 years. I have won many awards with my photography, shown in many galleries, and have been published in a few magazines. But my main motivation in all I do is imparting my passion for photography to others. 4th Place Award Sonja Longley



"I took this photo last April at the Wild Animal Park: ISO 400, aperture 1/60 sec, F3.5 @ 300mm. I just had my 28-300mm zoom and no tripod because it was very crowded, even early in the morning."

2nd Place Award Steve Schlesinger



"This is in Rundetaarn in Copenhagen. It was fairly dark and I had no tripod, so I had to lean against the wall. There were streams of people passing by. There was little coloration so it was a natural for B&W. In post processing, I had to remove noise, and expand the tonal range to bring out structure."

3rd Place AwardRobert Pendleton, M.D.



"This picture was taken in Calcutta, India, in Mother Teresa's Convent. I was standing on the veranda outside her room, looking down onto a washing station. The pat-

tern on the water is there because a nun had just walked away from the sink. I went to North Eastern India in June 2012 with Surgical Eye Expeditions (SEE) International to perform cataract surgery in two remote surgery centers."

"I've titled this one, 'Wall with Nails.' It was taken at a roadside gift shop during a Jim Cline photo trip to Oaxaca, Mexico last October."



Honorable Mention — Kathleen Nash

"There is an area in Glacier National Park that is dark and damp. Often, colorful mushrooms are found growing in that area. I found these growing on a half rotten log on the forest floor. They were about an inch tall, so getting onto the ground to get a picture of them was going to be a challenge. I picked up the log, placed it on another log at a more convenient height, pulled up my camp stool and tripod and started shooting. These were taken with a Canon Macro Lens, EF 100mm, L. These mushrooms are so colorful, I like to think that fairies dance beneath them." *Editor's Note: Kathleen Nash & Wayne Richard tied for the most number of honorable mentions at three each.*

4th Place Award

"This image is called, 'Study In Scarlet' and was shot in the gardens at Mission San Juan Capistrano. The background was removed in post processing."

Michael Seewald Gallery Award

Francine Filsinger



"The image, 'Rockstar Dreams' was created at night at a family oriented bar & grill. The young boy was doing his best Van Halen imitation with his toy guitar while rocking out to the rock and roll band performing on the stage before him. Once finally exhausted, he looked up at the front man/ rhythm guitarist in absolute awe hence the priceless expression. The image was very tricky

to shoot because there was minimal light available and no room for a tripod. Since it was being video taped, flash was not an option either. In addition, the child rarely stopped moving long enough to capture anything useful given the slow shutter speed. I shot the image handheld at an ISO setting of 10,000 using a Canon 5D MK III and a Canon 24-105mm f/4 L. The other specs were 70mm, f/4 at 1/30. The light is all ambient and the background is unaltered. The combination of the settings created a very painterly effect which was not created in post production. This is how the image was initially captured."

"The plant is 'Mother-In-Law's Tongue.' The original was fairly flat in terms of its overall tonal values and variations of green. I created 4 masks, each selecting a different set of the leaves. Then for each mask, I used Photoshop filters to change contrast values, lightness/darkness and saturation."

"This was taken in Sequoia National Park. I had been to this creek in the summertime, so I knew roughly where it had to be. I hiked in with snow shoes on day one and arrived about a half-hour too late. Next day, I stubbornly returned earlier and got what I wanted; the last light of day."

"For me, the bars in this El Centro, Havana image represent the economic prison that has been imposed by the long standing embargo on Cuba. On one side of the bars are ordinary citizens that

experience economic hardships on a daily basis. On the other side is hope for a better economy that they see and can almost reach, hopefully in the nearer rather than the more distant future."

Tech Tip by Mike McMahon Fire Evacuation - "Are you ready?"

Did the recent wildfires force you to evacuate? Natural disasters are reminders that we need to have our critical photos and videos backed up...ideally off-site.

The Poinsettia fire did force us to evacuate on Wednesday, May 14th. We were reasonably well prepared and had time to pack the car in an orderly manner. Yet, we still learned a few things...about things we forgot to take. All of my digital photos/videos were safely backed up on a drive in my safety box. But approximately 15 years of prints remained in the house, so we were forced to grab a heavy load of photo albums. My next project? You guessed it...scan the best of those prints for off-site backup.
