"The narrative creative framework informs and inspires all of my client and personal photography projects. For clients I am an event photojournalist: I seek and capture the visual story that unfolds at the



client's event. My personal interests include narrative and documentary approaches to urban scenes with cultural significance. Current projects include: contemporary protest-activism iconography, urban narratives with irony and juxtapositions, and narratives with isolation. I believe the photographer's role is to find the subject's message and translate it into a visual narrative that the viewer can understand intuitively and quickly. The successful image is a meaningful visual-literacy partnership between the creator and the viewer."



My first childhood memories are full of adventures with Aunt Mary. These adventures always included her camera and then the Brownie box camera she gave me for my fifth birthday with 10 rolls of film. We made a deal - once I used up the ten rolls, I would then start paying for my own film and she would pay to have the film developed. This tactic taught me to wait patiently until just the right time to take the photograph so I didn't waste any shots. Aunt Mary was always inventing odd jobs for me so I could earn money to pay for my film and our

cocker spaniel, Penny, was bribed with many tidbits to sit perfectly still and look at the little girl with a camera for a face.

Visualizing the photograph and making it happen present some of the hardest challenges and most rewarding results and experiences. Each time I pick up my camera (or use my cell phone camera) I have a chance to learn and practice my skills. I feel like I've only scratched the surface of educational opportunities. The people I've met and opportunities presented at NCPS have been a huge part of appreciating and enjoying photography.
