But, when it comes from someone else it gets annoying after a while. So, you can ask them, "When you have an excellent meal, would you ask a chef what type of frying pan they used?" And, you can continue the conversation from there. If an admirer of one of your photos asks whether you used Photoshop, implying that the image is somehow less worthy, you can ask them, "When you have an excellent meal, would you ask a chef if they used any herbs or spices in their recipes?" Now these answers are too short and rather rude, but they suggest how to start a conversation. And then you can discuss how you created the image.

As we start 2014, I thought I'd share with you a few thoughts I've had these past few days about how I can become a better photographer. It helps me to spend just a bit of time evaluating my photography as it is now, and how I want it to be next year at this time.

We all consciously or unconsciously think that this is the year we become better photographers. How do we do this? Shoot more? It sounds good, but probably won't make us better photographers.

I think the first step is to think about our photography goals for this coming year. What areas are we strong in? What are our weaknesses? If we're specific about both strengths and weaknesses, we can actually lay out a plan of action to work on both. Sometimes it helps to look at our older work. Can you spot passions/trends? Are there areas that you really want to concentrate on?

Secondly, get better at editing your work. Be ruthless in deleting those photos that don't live up to the standards you had in mind when you shot the photo. Which pictures have the greatest potential and how do we apply the finishing touches? To me, applying the finishing touches means to get better at using the software. This is my primary goal for this year.

Lastly, think about our gear. I know it's nice to have the latest and greatest, but is our gear actually holding us back? If that is the case, it may be time to think about an upgrade in some piece of equipment.



At: 1200 Getty Center Dr., Los Angeles



The club VLT will then select 10 images and enter them into the contest. DEADLINE for submissions to the VLT is January 31.
